and Sustainability Traditional Native American gardening techniques often prioritized these values The land s long term health was guaranteed by the use of techniques including terracing agroforestry and water management The gardening techniques used by Native Americans varied greatly from one tribe to the next reflecting differences in climate resources and cultural norms These ways of life have been vital to Native American culture and history for generations and they have supported indigenous populations
